From our Transitional Pastor

Greetings Immanuel Family,

I would like to share an article I read about the birth of Jesus Christ as our greatest gift. I pray that you will connect with the message, and it draws you closer to the Spirit during this Christmas season.

The Greatest Gift of All; The Birth of Jesus Christ by Greg Laurie

When Christmas rolls around, you often try to figure out if certain people have bought that gift you wanted. Maybe you already know what they purchased because they didn't hide it very well. Or perhaps you uncovered it by accident-or maybe not. But when the day comes and you open the present, you must pretend you're surprised. Yet all along, you knew what it was.

God's gift to us, however, was a complete surprise. It was not expected, and as you examine it more carefully, you realize how great a gift it was. God's gift came to us in the humblest of wrappings. What would you think if you saw a gift under your Christmas tree wrapped in newspaper and tied up with string? At first, you would probably assume that a guy wrapped it. But think about God's gift to us. Jesus was not born in a palace of gold; He was born in a stable and clothed in rags and lying in a feeding trough. Yet these things do not, in any way, diminish the story of Christ's birth. If anything, they help us realize God's great sacrifice for us. God's gift to humanity, the ultimate gift of eternal life through His Son, Jesus Christ, came in the simplest and humblest of wrappings.

From our Transitional Pastor

At Christmas, we give gifts to those we care about, who have been kind to us over the past year, or offered us a gift first. We don't give gifts to the person who talks bad about us or to the angry neighbor who never has a kind word to say. Yet God gave us his gift when we were his enemies. God didn't give this gift to us because we deserved it. It was just the opposite. The Bible says, "But God demonstrates His love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8 NKJV).

The gift tells us something about the giver. When you want to give someone a gift, you start thinking about it ahead of time. Hopefully, you find what that person wants or needs. When God decided to give us the gift of eternal life, it wasn't something on the fly. Long before there was a town called Bethlehem, a garden called Eden, and a planet called Earth, God decided to send Jesus, born of a woman, made under the law, to redeem those under the law. Make no mistake; God gave us the most sacrificial gift he could have offered.

So, Christmas isn't about the gifts you have under your tree right now. All those things will be gone one day. Christmas is about knowing the God who made you and gave you the greatest gift you will ever receive.

Church Council

Minutes of Immanuel UCC Council Meeting Tuesday, November 8, 2022

Those present: on ZOOM Charlie Miller and Phil Frohne (visitor). In person: Teddy Branom, Doug Daniels, Paula Hildebrand, Walter Martinez (newly elected) Darrell Thies, Charles Wolfersberger, Don Morice, Nancy Remmert and Pastor Deon. Not present: Julie Guethler.

Meeting was called to order by Charles Wolfersberger at 7:05 p.m. We were led in Devotions by Phil Frohne who read a devotion entitled Improbable Growth by our previous Associate Pastor Phiwa Langeni. Phil, having resigned from the Council expressed his appreciation for his time on the Council, wished us well and left the meeting.

In an attempt to reduce the length of Council meetings, committee reports were submitted in printed form and read by members in advance of the meeting.

The Council went into Executive Session and resumed regular business at 7:40 p.m.

After much discussion in executive session and numerous conversations with Pastor Deon, it was decided that it was time to consider inviting Pastor Deon as our settled pastor at Immanuel. It was further decided that this must be a joint decision by the entire congregation of Immanuel. It must be as inclusive as possible. A process was agreed to that will involve 1.) Sending a letter (via US Mail) to the congregation announcing our intentions, 2.) Provide for a comment period where members can submit their opinions and ask questions, and 3.) Formally announce a date when the congregation can vote to officially "call" Pastor Deon McKenzie as Immanuel's settled pastor.

Nancy Remmert asked for a point of personal privilege to express her appreciation for Pastor Deon and Charlie Wolfersberger attending the Interfaith Partnership celebration where she received IP's Life Achievement Award. The flowers she received were lovely. Charlie Wolfersberger reported that Immanuel made a \$500 donation to Interfaith Partnership which was approved by an email vote.

Church Council Cont'd

The minutes of the previous meeting were reviewed and accepted without correction by acclamation.

Financial Reports were given by Paula Hildebrand and Doug Daniels. Paula noted an uptick in attendance in October. Accepted by acclamation. Doug is developing the 2023 annual budget and is setting up a meeting with the Budget and Finance Committee in order to finalize it.

Nancy Remmert reporting for Christians in Action (CIA) called attention to the Summons of Joy sponsored by NCCU (North County Churches Uniting for Racial Justice and Harmony). She moved that we donate \$1,000 to Summons of Joy which presently is functioning in Florissant but hopefully will be expanded to Ferguson. Don Morice seconded the motion and the motion passed. Stipulation that if the Ferguson Summons of Joy begins this year the funds will go to Ferguson. CIA will fill Blessing Bags on Tuesday, November 15. They will organize what needs to be purchased on Sunday November 13. The group will decorate the sanctuary on November 22 at 6 p.m. with dinner following at the Brewery.

NCCU has also announced the Annual Oratory Contest. The contest is open to individuals from grade 3 to Senior Citizens. The Theme is: "It Starts with Me: Cultivating the Beloved Community". Pastor Deon and Nancy Remmert will prepare an announcement giving details to the congregation for anyone who might like to participate in the Contest.

P.R.O.U.D. (People Reaching Out for Unity and Diversity) would like to hold a meeting in the Immanuel Reception Room. Date will need to be decided. Their request conflicts with Choir Rehearsal for the December Cantata. They would also like to host a showing of the film: *The Long Shadow* during Black History Month (February).

Church Council Cont'd

North County Interfaith Dialogue Group meets every Third Sunday in Room 202 from 2 to 4 p.m. In December the guest will be Dr. Sofia Grewal a member of the Sikh Faith.

Don Morice reported on Property and Grounds by calling attention to up-coming necessary repairs, purchase, etc. and will be sharing this with Doug as the budget for 2023 is developed. In addition, there is a problem with the hot water heater in the Educ. Bldg. which will be investigated.

Pastor Deon reported visits with Ida Cookson, assisting the Vortmeier Family at Jean Vortmeier's interment. He and Teddy Branom attended the Conference Annual Gathering in Jefferson City and participated in a "Silent Disco" event which they both enjoyed. He also visited Ed Viehmann and Sue Schuster and presented a program for Immanuel Fellowship. Paula Hildebrand recommended he try to reach out to Stephanie Sittingdown through the Bogdajewicz family. Stephanie's mother Becky died recently.

Teddy Branom reported that the Transitional Conference Minister has been offered an extended call. During a ZOOM call the call was approved by unanimous acclamation.

Charlie Wolfersberger reported that he is still working with George Hildebrand (Policy and Personnel) on filling the Administrative Assistant role. Some candidates have been offered the position only to turn it down days later with better offers. The search continues. In addition, it is desired to start the search for a Music Director. Charlie will work out details with Phil Lum.

Paula Hildebrand reported that the Nominating Committee had completed their work and reported that the slate of officers was elected with Charlie Miller approved to complete the one-year

term that was vacated when Phil Frohne resigned from Council. (Charlie M. can decide to run for a full three year term if he so desires in 2023.)

Technology and Investment committees had no reports at this time.

Board of Christian Education: Paula Hildebrand reported that the committee is hoping to encourage the young people to return to church. They are planning several activities in January. On January 8, they will meet with the young people and gather their in-put regarding what they would like to do. January 15 will be a recognition of Martin Luther King, Jr. day. January 22 they will center on Scripture and January 29, they will do a Valentine's Day project for the Shut-ins.

Stewardship Committee: November 13 has been designated Stewardship Sunday.

Paula Hildebrand invited everyone to her home for her annual Christmas gathering on December 11 at 6 p.m. Those who plan to attend should let her know if they will bring snacks or dessert.

The next meeting of the Council will be Tuesday, December 13, 2022. Everyone is invited to bring snacks to share. At that time, the Council will reorganize for the coming year. Teddy Branom, Paula Hildebrand and Darrell Thies will have completed their terms on the Council. Newly elected members are: John Bogdajewicz, Walter Martinez, Karl Klasing and Charlie Miller.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:02 pm with reciting of the Lord's Prayer.


ADULT FAITH EXPLORATION




