Minutes of the Church Council Tuesday, January 10, 2023

President Charlie Miller called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m. and offered a devotion.

Minutes of the December meeting were approved by acclamation. Karl Klasing and Doug Daniels presented the financial reports. A motion to accept the reports was made by Don Morice seconded by Charlie Wolfersberger. Motion passed.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor has been in touch with Joan Neuman, who has been ill; Sheila Wedemeyer, who recently lost her brother. Policy and Personnel is working on filling the vacant staff positions. In the meantime, volunteers will help in the church office while the search for an Administrative Assistant continues. Other vacant positions will be reviewed to determine duties, hours, salary, etc.

PROPERTY AND GROUNDS: Don Morice reported that he and Debbie Bahr had met and compiled a list of projects that need to be considered. Most of the list are issues that need to be faced with buildings the age of Immanuel's. Priorities will be determined and projects will be done as time and money are appropriate. Emergencies will be handled as needed.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION: John Bogdajewicz reported the committee is collecting input for a new job description for the Director of Christian Education/Youth Coordinator. Members are asked to submit five ideas as to what they would like to see for this position. Youth are planning to send Valentines to the home bound. John Viehmann will prepare a brief biography of each home bound member so the youth will know more about these individuals. Having Activity Bags available for young children attending worship was discussed. Lenten Devotionals will be ordered for Adults, youth ages 13-High School and younger children and distributed before Lent begins. Permission slips were discussed. The present version will be reviewed and brought into compliance with Safe Church Policy. Paula and George Hildebrand are collecting information from parents, youth and children regarding their needs and expectations about restoring Sunday School and Youth Programs at Immanuel. Once a proposal is determined, the BCE will meet with the Worship Committee.

STEWARDSHIP: Karl Klasing had no report at this time.

CIA (Christians in Action) Nancy Remmert reported that the next CIA meeting is January 17, 2023 to plan activities and projects for 2023. Blessing Bags were prepared and distributed to the congregation in November.

North County Churches United will hold the awards ceremony for their Oratory Contest winners as part of the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. celebration at Florissant Valley Community College, January 17, 2023 beginning with a reception at 5 p.m. with program to follow. Contest winners will present their winning essay and be awarded \$100 and other gits from sponsor of the event. PROUD (People Reaching out for Unity and Diversity) requested the use of the Reception Room on February 10 from 5 p.m. to 9 p.m. They will be presenting the film *The Long Shadow* followed by discussion. There will be no charge for the event. The public will be invited.

INTERFAITH DIALOGUE in North County will meet on Sunday, January 15, 2023 from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. in Room 204, the Guest will be Swami Chetanananta from the Vedanta Society. The meeting is informal and open to everyone. PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY continues. Prayer shawls are available for the congregation to share with elderly or ill individuals who might appreciate one. Gift cards are available.

MISSION POSSIBLE: Julie Guethler reported that funds that were available were spent to stock the shelves with appropriate items to be placed in the Blessing Box. Judy Sherman will monitor the Blessing Box. The meals that we provide for All Among Us and Lydia's House will begin again soon.

WORSHIP COMMITTEE: Charlie Miller had no report at this time. Committee will meet soon.

POLICY AND PERSONNEL: Charlie Wolfersberger reported that he is willing to assist Charlie Miller, Doug Daniels and Damien Lake as they work out the details of calling Pastor Deon McKenzie as our Settled Pastor. The vacant staff positions are, Administrative Assistant, (exploring the possibility of using a temporary agency to fill the position until a permanent person can be hired). Director of Church Music (a job description prepared by the Music Search Committee will be posted in January to appropriate music related sites). Parish Nurse (no action has been taken at this time). Rental Rates for the Education Building will be reviewed and updated. An inquiry from Welcome St. Louis regarding renting the Parsonage will precipitate a review of the lease agreement if and when we get more information and make a decision about the use of the Parsonage. A meeting of the Policy and Personnel Committee will be Sunday, January 29, 2023 following worship.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE: Charlie Wolfersberger and Julie Guethler, no report at this time.

BUDGET AND FINANCE: Doug Daniels reported that an Audit of the accounts should be performed. He will organize a group to complete the Audit.

TECHNOLOGY: Walter Martinez, no report at this time.

INVESTMENTS: Karl Klasing will schedule a time for the Financial Advisor to meet with the Council.

PARISH NURSE: Linda Stoecklin reported that she spent 33 hours during the last month making 78 contacts with individuals by telephone, texts, emails, and written notes. Her contacts were higher this month because she sent Christmas messages and was saddened by the number of families she contacted who suffered the loss of loved ones. She also sent her congratulations to Immanuel for calling Pastor Deon as our settled Pastor.

OLD BUSINESS: All items were handled through committee reports. A cart for the flat screen TV monitor was purchased to more easily transport the TV from building to building.

NEW BUSINESS: A discussion was held but no decision was made regarding the Whitling Family donation to Immanuel. Further discussion was tabled until next meeting. Also tabled was the necessity to update the Bank Signature Cards.

No further business appearing, the meeting was adjourned by unanimous vote of a motion by Don Morice and seconded by Karl Klasing. Meeting adjourned at 8:45 p.m.

New Business




