From our Pastor

Immanuel Disciples,

One of the first things we learn as children is that we should never play with fire. For many of us, all it took was for our parents to say, "Don't play with fire." Others of us heard those words and did not heed them until we burned ourselves. Perhaps we played with matches carelessly or intentionally touched a hot stove. With these dangers in mind, we can understand why the proverb "if you play with fire, you get burned" is so memorable and popular. We all know that fire causes injury when handled carelessly, so it is easy to use the imagery in a broader context to warn ourselves not to get involved with potentially dangerous persons or situations. If we do, we will not escape injury.

Did you know? October is *Fire Prevention Month*, a time to raise awareness about fire safety and protect homes and families. The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) named the second week of October Fire Prevention Week in commemoration of the Great Chicago Fire in 1871. Today, we celebrate Fire Prevention Week and Month by spreading fire safety awareness and educating families, students, and communities across the United States with help from local fire departments. I am encouraging you to gather your family and discuss fire safety. Take some time to enjoy the moments and memories you create with your loved ones, with peace of mind knowing you are protected.

Let me remind you that installing reliable fire protection devices and being proactive is important to help keep you and your family safe from a fire or carbon monoxide emergency.

- Almost 3 of every 5 home fire deaths resulted from fires with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms (NFPA)
- Carbon monoxide is the #1 cause of accidental poisoning in the US
- Unattended cooking is the #1 cause of home fires (NFPA).
- A fire department responds to a fire every 23 seconds in America (NFPA)

Let's work together to prevent fires and keep our families and communities safe!

Minutes of the Church Council Meeting September 12, 2023

Present: John Bogdajewicz, Karl Klasing, Julie Guethler, Nancy Remmert, Charlie Miller, Don Morice, Charlie Wolfersberger, Pastor Deon McKenzie.

Absent: Doug Daniels, Walter Martinez

Meeting was called to order at 7:01 p.m. Karl Klasing shared a devotion. Minutes were reviewed a motion was made and seconded (Charles Wolfersberger/Karl Klasing) to accept the minutes. Motion passed.

Financial Reports were presented by Karl Klasing. Including reviewing the report by Doug Daniels received in the packet.

Pastor's Report: Pastor continues to contemplate the direction and priorities for Immanuel. He has met with Sarah Hemmingway, the Youth Coordinator outlining some plans regarding the use of social media to promote the youth programs. Pastor feels we need to be sure that all social media outlets are connected to the church. He continues to contact our home-bound members with visits and/or phone calls. He attended the St. Louis Association meeting and the North County Kiwanis Breakfast where he is serving as President. He is waiting to hear if he has been accepted as a member of the North County Chamber of Commerce. His membership in these community organizations brings Immanuel into the wider community. On a sad note, he will be attending the funerals of three teenagers killed in a traffic accident. These youngsters were students in the Ladue School District where Kimberly McKenzie is employed.

Parish Nurse Report: Nurse Linda Stoecklin reported that she spent 32 hours on Immanuel's behalf sending emails, texts and written notes and making referrals for two members. She is working with members to find assistance to help pay for over priced medications.

Church Council Cont'd

It was suggested that a program be held to inform the congregation regarding insurance advantage plans available. Also, an update of the church records should include parishioners "end of life" plans or requests.

Property and Grounds Report: Don Morice submitted a report of ten major projects that have been completed this year. In addition, he submitted a list of future projects in the Sanctuary and Education Building which will be completed as necessary and funds are available. Don Morice moved, that repairs to the Garage behind the Parsonage be completed by John Beal Company at a cost of \$3200.00. It was seconded by Julie Guethler. Motion passed.

Board of Christian Education: John Bogdajewicz reported the group had met twice since the Council's last meeting. Sarah Hemmingway has been hired as the Youth Coordinator for 15 hours a week. A request has been made to the congregation to supply an additional adult to be present at the Confirmation classes. This requirement meets the safety precautions presently in place. Since the BCE is in a position of needing to fill five vacancies on the committee this year, John Viehmann will submit a plan to the Council to correct the term limits which will result in a better plan of rotation of BCE members.

Stewardship: Karl Klasing reported that the Stewardship Theme for this year is: "Because of You". The Stewardship committee is Karl Klasing, Charlie Miller, Paula Hildebrand, and George Hildebrand. They will meet soon to set the date for Stewardship Sunday and begin the campaign.

Christians in Action (CIA) Nancy Remmert reported on plans for a visit to the Botanical Gardens for the Chilhuly Glass display and that a trip to the horse races in Illinois is tentatively planned for November.

Church Council Cont'd

As part of our community outreach, Nancy represents Immanuel on the NCCU Board (North County Churches Uniting for Racial Harmony and Justice) She requested the Council members to review the NCCU Covenant which will be presented to the congregation during a re-covenant worship service before November 12. Nancy also requested the Council review the information about Compassionate St. Louis. At the Council's next meeting, they will consider becoming endorsers of the Compassionate St. Louis movement.

Mission Possible: Julie Guethler reported that the Festival of Sharing kits are requested during September. Immanuel participated in Habitat for Humanity and the ECH Christmas Food Boxes are the next project.

Worship Committee: Charlie Miller reported the Worship Committee is scheduled to meet on Sunday, October 29 following worship at 10:45 a.m. The Committee meets on the Fifth Sunday of months when that occurs.

Nominating Committee: Charlie Wolfersberger and Julie Guethler reported that the committee has assembled four candidates for the three vacancies to be filled on Church Council and five candidates for the five openings on the Board of Christian Education.

Technology: Walter Martinez was not present to give a report. Pastor Deon recommended that passwords, and other information about our technical equipment be located in one place for easy access.

Investment: Karl Klasing reported that two CDs were renewed at a favorable interest rate.

Church Council Cont'd

Old Business: The Church Safety Plan was reviewed and was approved by consensus as presented with minor adjustments. Training for church leaders, ushers and congregation will be held so the Safety Plan can be effective.

The Unleashing Possibilities contract for 2023-24 has been completed. There will be no after school program this year. UP will hold training session Monday through Thursday, hold Play Day on the fourth Saturday and possibly plan something special for Halloween on October 28. **New Carts for Kitchen.** It was moved and seconded (Karl Klasing/Julie Guethler) that up to \$200 plus \$913 donated by the Bowling League be spent to purchase four carts for the kitchen. Motion passed.

The Council moved into Executive Session at 9:13 p.m.

Council resumed at 9:41 with no future business appearing, the Council adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.


