READING OF MATTHEW 21:23-32

²³ When he entered the temple, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to him as he was teaching and said, "By what authority are you doing these things, and who gave you this authority?" ²⁴ Jesus said to them, "I will also ask you one question; if you tell me the answer, then I will also tell you by what authority I do these

things. ²⁵ Did the baptism of John come from heaven, or was it of human origin?" And they argued with one another, "If we say, 'From heaven,' he will say to us, 'Why, then, did you not believe him?' ²⁶ But if we say, 'Of human origin,' we are afraid of the crowd, for all regard John as a prophet." ²⁷ So they answered Jesus, "We do not know." And he said to them, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I am doing these things. ²⁸ "What do you think? A man had two sons; he went to the first and said, 'Son, go and work in the vineyard today.' ²⁹ He answered, 'I will not,' but later he changed his mind and went. 30 The father went to the second and said the same, and he answered, 'I go, sir,' but he did not go. 31 Which of the two did the will of his father?" They said, "The first." Jesus said to them, "Truly I tell you; the tax collectors and the prostitutes are going into the kingdom of God ahead of you. 32 For John came to you in the way of righteousness, and you did not believe him, but the tax collectors and the prostitutes believed him, and even after you saw it you did not change your minds and believe him.

INVITATION

Pastor: Let us give thanks to God Most High.

COMMUNION PRAYER

Pastor: God, we gather at this table representing all people in all places in our world. We bless and pass the bread and cup as Christ passed it to his friends. Please allow these elements to remind us of the good you have done and inspire us to do the good Christ calls us to do. We thank You for making us in Your image, forgiving us when we act as though You have no claim on us, and keeping us in Your steadfast care. May we leave this table revived and refreshed, having

sipped from the cup of bold courage to challenge all forms of injustice and pain. In Christ's name, we pray. Amen.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION

Pastor: We remember that on the night of betrayal and desertion, Jesus took bread, gave you thanks, broke the bread, and gave it to the disciples, saying: "This is my body which is broken for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, Jesus also took the cup, after supper, saying: "This cup is the new Covenant in my blood. Do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." By eating this bread and drinking this cup, we proclaim Christ's death, celebrate Christ's resurrection, and await Christ's coming again.

People: Amen, Come, Christ Jesus!

BLESSING OF ELEMENTS

Pastor: Gracious God, as we break bread and drink from the cup, we ask for Your blessings to pour upon us, oh gracious God. May Your Holy Spirit fill us with the strength and courage to be the body of Christ, and to be the salt, and light that spreads Your word throughout the world.
