

Minutes of the Church Council Meeting March 12, 2024

Present: John Bogdajewicz, Doug Daniels, Karl Klasing, Don Morice, Nancy Remmert, Melinda Schuster, Judy Sherman, Pastor Deon McKenzie.

Absent: Walter Martinez, Martha Snead

Council Members gathered at 6:00 p.m. to meet with Jonathan Devers, our Edward Jones Investment Advisor. Mr. Devers reviewed our investment portfolio.

The meeting was called to order by President Don Morice at 7:12 p.m. Melinda Schuster shared a devotion based on Psalms and Isaiah.

Minutes of the February 13, 2024 meeting were reviewed and corrected (minor typos). It was moved and seconded by Judy Sherman/Melinda Schuster that minutes be accepted as corrected. Motion carried.

Karl Klasing and Doug Daniels presented the financial reports. It was moved and seconded John Bogdajewicz/Judy Sherman that the financial reports be accepted as presented. Motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor has been in touch with congregants either by phone calls and pastoral visits. Ash Wednesday Services were held February 14 at 1:30 and 7:00 p.m. Palm Sunday and Youth Sunday will be combined and Communion will be offered. Easter Sunday service will include Communion. Following worship, the Annual Easter Egg Hunt will be held on the church grounds as well as in the both buildings. The live-streaming was successful on March 10. Hopefully, the problems have been resolved.

Pastor's community involvement included meeting with Affinia

Healthcare, Unleashing Potential and Habitat for Humanity.

St. Louis Association All-In UCC online services are open and available to any interested individuals. They are planning monthly on-line gatherings as well as in-person gatherings in public spaces in the more rural areas.

Missouri Mid-South held a Conference Youth Event for High School age individuals at Camp MoVal February 16-19, 2025. Clergy retreat scheduled April 7-9, 2024 at Shannondale for the solar eclipse. The Council for Health & Human Service Ministries held their Annual Gathering in St. Louis March 12-14, 2024. A group from MMSC plans to participate in the Selma to Montgomery Race Series, a 51-mile relay and bike ride commemorates the 1965 march led by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Pastor reported that the first aid kits need to be updated. The carbon monoxide detectors in the sanctuary and education buildings have been installed. Smoke detectors have been checked. A security services coordinator is needed.

PARISH NURSE REPORT

Linda Stoecklin submitted a 2-month report covering January and February. She provided 64 hours of service on our behalf during this time period: Making 96 phone calls, sending 12 emails, 30 texts and writing 10 notes. She made 3 referrals for individuals. She also reported that she will be off during the last week of March for a medical procedure.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Property and Grounds</u>: John Bogdajewicz reported the following completed projects: Outside concrete repairs, the Sanctuary Door Push bars, and additional cameras have been installed on the second floor of the Education Building. Other projects being finished: Education Building Security System, Lighting project

(Ameren paid \$7,297.48), Karl Klasing and Tim Payer worked on the gym lights, Reinhold Electric will come to check on lights that keep going out. A new refrigerator/freezer for the Sanctuary building has been delivered at a cost of \$1,457.00 including \$128.00 to remove the two old ones. Tim Payer has volunteered to build shelfing to fill the extra space left because of the difference in size of the unit. Maintenance needs to be done: Following the Education Building elevator inspection, Allrise Elevator Company will schedule a date and give a bid to make repairs that are needed. The gym heating blower is bad and will be replaced. The Parsonage repair of the walls damaged during the plumbing repairs need to be completed.

<u>Board of Christian Education</u>: Karl Klasing reported that Sarah Hemingway had youth gatherings on February 11, (9 children) February 25, (8 children) March 3, (7 children) She is planning gatherings on April 14 and 28 both centered around prayer. Positions for Youth Sunday have been filled and 433 eggs are ready for the Easter Egg Hunt. There will be 2 Golden Eggs with larger prizes. The hunt will be inside and outside at both buildings.

A sign-up sheet for Pickle Ball will be in the Narthex to determine interest. Peggy Nofles met with Sarah Klasing and the tentative dates for Vacation Bible School are June 24-28. Peggy will begin distributing information about the VBS after Easter. Donations of snack items for participants and possibly canned goods for the Food Pantry will be requested. Minister Kimberly has offered an Adult VBS option this year to be held in the evenings of Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. More about this later. Jennifer Jansen brough a list of items that BCE previously led or was in charge of. The list will be reviewed.

Mission Possible: Melinda Schuster reported that the Room at the Inn meal on February 29 went well. They served pizza, salad, fruit, brownies, ice cream and toppings, lemonade and iced

tea. They served 10 to 15 people at the shelter. On March 6, 2024, meals were served at Lydia's House and All Among Us to a total of 55 women and children who were provided with a Baked Potato Bar with various toppings, green salad, fresh fruit, beverages and desserts. These projects were possible because cash donations, food donations and volunteers made them happen. The next meals will be provided on Wednesday, June 5. Habitat for Humanity four Immanuel members attended the Corned Beef and Cabbage Dinner at Samuel UCC which was a fund raiser for Habitat. The next Mission Possible meeting will be Wednesday, April 3 at 7 p.m. via ZOOM.

The following Committees had no report at this time: Stewardship, Christians in Action, Worship, Nominating, Budget and Finance, Technology, and Investment.

OLD BUSINESS: Plans for the Russell Viehmann recognition to be held in June are underway. Julie Guethler and Melinda Schuster are coordinating this event. The Church Council will meet on Saturday, March 23, 2024 from 9:00 a.m. to 3 p.m. for a Transformation Conference.

NEW BUSINESS: CPR and AED training. Julie Guethler and Nancy Reidy will be contacted regarding this. A new contract with Unleashing Potential has been negotiated. They have requested use of the Parsonage during their 2-week summer camp so they can separate older and younger children for this event. It was moved and seconded (Judy Sherman/Karl Klasing) that this request be granted. Motion carried.

The next Council meeting is Tuesday, April 9, 2024 at 7 p.m. John Bogdajewicz will share a devotional. Meeting was adjourned at 9:10 p.m.
