The Bible describes several spiritual gifts, and the ways we as believers of Jesus Christ use them. All gifts are significant, and all come from the same Spirit. They are all meant to point us to God, and they are to be used for the good of God's people. Below are the gifts given by the Spirit and the scriptural references:

Administration (1 Corinthians 12:28)

Apostleship (1 Corinthians 12:28; Ephesians 4:11)

Discernment (1 Corinthians 12:10)

Evangelism (Ephesians4:11)

Exhortation/Encouragement (Romans 12:8)

Faith (1 Corinthians 12:9)

Giving (Romans 12:8)

Helping (1 Corinthians 12:28)

Knowledge (1 Corinthians 12:8)

Leadership (1 Corinthians 12:8)

Mercy (Romans 12:8)

Pastoring (Ephesians 4:11)

Service (Romans 12:7)

Teaching (Romans 12:7; 1 Corinthians 12:28; Ephesians 4:11)

Romans 12:6-8 (GW) Paul says, "God in his kindness gave each of us different gifts. If your gift is speaking what God has revealed, make sure what you say agrees with the Christian faith. If your gift is serving, then devote yourself to serving. If it is teaching, devote yourself to teaching. If it is encouraging others, devote yourself to giving encouragement. If it is sharing, be generous. If it is leadership, lead enthusiastically. If it is helping people in need, help them cheerfully."

While each of us has specific gifts, all the gifts serve one primary purpose: to glorify God and God alone. Spiritual gifts draw attention to God's goodness and encourage those who believe in Him. Spiritual gifts should never be used to call attention to us or to make ourselves appear more important than anyone else. The Spirit empowers us to use our gifts in ways that point to God.

How to determine your gift.

As we grow in our faith and learn to recognize the Holy Spirit in our lives, we grow in awareness of the gifts we already have. When we obey the Holy Spirit, we open ourselves up to be led and guided in every aspect of our lives, including utilizing our spiritual gifts. In essence, growing in faith and recognizing the Holy Spirit in our lives is inseparable from increasing awareness of our gifts. It is a continual transformation and renewal journey, marked by moments of revelation and empowerment.

What's the next step.

Prayerfully meditating on the above scriptures allows us to open our hearts and minds to the promptings of the Holy Spirit. Through prayer, we humbly seek God's guidance and illumination, asking Him to reveal the gifts He has graciously endowed us with. This, my friends, invites God to work in our lives, shaping and molding us according to His purposes.

The meeting was called to order by President Don Morice at 6:59 p.m. John Bogdajewicz offered a devotion.

Minutes of the March 12, 2024 Council meeting were reviewed. A motion to accept the minutes as printed in the Council packet was made by Judy Sherman and seconded by Melinda Schuster. Motion carried.

The Financial Reports were given by Karl Klasing and Doug Daniels. A motion was made by Judy Sherman and seconded by John Bogdajewicz to accept the financial report as printed. Motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Church

Pastor reported that he has been assisting the family members of Geraldine Becker who passed away this afternoon.

Pastor reported that the Council Transformation Conference held March 23 was successfully attended by the entire Council as we considered our Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and our visions for the future. He acknowledged the return of the Choir after they sang on Easter. He reported that the Ash Wednesday/Lenten Midday and Evening Devotional Study/Good Friday Services/Easter Sunday Service/and Easter Egg Hunt were successful and well attended.

The new alarm system has been installed in the Education Building and instructions on its use will be put in place once it is activated. Carbon Monoxide detectors have been installed in both

buildings. Smoke detectors have been checked. Unleashing Potential has announced their Summer Camp will be held from June 10 to July 26. They have requested use of the Parsonage for the older children in the program. The repairs that are needed at the Parsonage will be completed in time for the Camp session. Facebook/Livestream continues to be monitored for optimal operation.

Community

Pastor Deon reported that he has been elected to the Executive Board of Unleashing Potential.

Missouri Mid-South Conference Great Lakes & West Central Regional Youth Event will be held July 17-20, 2024 at Augustana College in Rock Island, IL Theme: Team-Fear. This is the first Regional Youth Event since 2018. The event is for youth who will complete grades 6-12 before the event. One adult is required for each 1-5 youth attending. Camp Shannondale held a Great American Eclipse Day Program on April 8.

Camp MoVal Women's Retreat will be May 3-5 Theme: God's World, Handle with Care. Registration deadline is April 23. Cost \$150 for full weekend or \$75 for one day-only. Pastor also shared events that the National Office has announced. Details are available on the UCC website. https://www.ucc.org

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL


