#### Minutes of the Church Council Meeting August 12, 2025

Present: John Bogdajewicz, Timothy Guethler, Karl Klasing, Walter Martinez, Don Morice, Nancy Remmert, Melinda Schuster, Martha Snead, Pastor Deon McKenzie.

Absent: Judy Sherman

Guests: Executives from UP: Darlene and Gloria.

President Don Morice called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Don shared a devotion.

Don Morice opened the floor for the UP representatives to share their plans for the future. Because of the uncertainty of the government funding for their programs, they shared the plans to ensure that their programs will continue by reducing staff by closing some existing locations and moving the programs to Immanuel. They will combine the programs from four schools serving children in Grades 3-5 from September to May in addition to the summer program already in existence at Immanuel. The Council was open to their proceeding on their plans. We are open to their using our facilities for the "After-school program" as well as the "Summer Program" if all necessary inspections, licenses and rental contract, including cleaning, can be mutually completed satisfactorily for Immanuel and UP. It was moved and seconded (Martha Snead/Melinda Schuster) that we move forward with plans to increase the building use by UP. Motion Carried. Pastor will have to contact Narcotics Anonymous regarding their meeting on Wednesday evenings may need to adjust their time of meeting.

The Council returned to the printed agenda for the remainder of the meeting.

Minutes of the July 8, 2025 were reviewed. It was moved and seconded (John Bogdajewicz/Melinda Schuster) that the

minutes be accepted as printed. Motion carried.

Financial reports were reported by Karl Klasing, in the absence of Judy Sherman. It was moved and seconded (Nancy Remmert/John Bogdajewicz) that the financial reports be accepted as printed. Motion carried.

#### PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor reported that the Temple of God Church will be using the Chapel on Sundays. They have requested that they use the Sanctuary Building for a wider church meeting which will be held in the future on a Sunday afternoon. It was decided that our lack of staff to cover such an event would not work. Pastor will inform them of our decision. A towel dispenser in one of the restrooms was broken during the summer program. UP paid for the repairs. The lights in the gym are not working properly Reinhold Electric will come and assess the problem. The new cleaning company is working out well. Pastor announced that the St. Louis Association will meet on October 4, location to be decided. The Missouri-Mid-South Conference will be meeting on October 17 & 18, location to be decided. Youth Sunday will be August 24. Pastor will be on vacation from August 25 through August 31. Darrell Thies will bring the message on August 31.

#### PARISH NURSE REPORT: Linda Stoecklin

Linda reported for June and July. In June, she made 29 phone calls, 8 texts, and 3 emails, wrote 2 notes and assisted with one referral spending 32 hours on behalf in June. In July, she made 35 phone calls, 15 texts, wrote 3 notes and assisted with one referral spending 33 hours on our behalf during July. We are grateful for her generous support of our congregation.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

PROPERTY AND GROUNDS: John Bogdajewicz

John reported that the Parsonage has been secured after our experience with a squatter staying in the basement. A discus-

sion was held as to whether the basement outside door should be eliminated or strongly secured. No one was happy with the way the evergreen trees were trimmed. John will get a bid that will include replacing the trees, installing a sprinkler system, resodding the Sanctuary lawn. Sodding should be done no later than October. John has received a contract for the maintenance of the Air Conditioning systems in both buildings. It is \$5,520 which is a sizable increase. He will investigate our options. John has found a contractor who seems qualified to make improvements to the Ladies Restroom in the Sanctuary building.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION: Martha Snead BCE met on August 5, 2025. They reviewed their budget. They will have a final reading of their revised By-laws and will give them to the Council to be added to the Church By-laws presently being reviewed. They discussed the necessity to have advanced planning for all of their activities. Particularly the Vacation Bible School planning should start much earlier. This year's VBS had 16 participants plus teenage and adult volunteers. Money collected during VBS will be donated to St. Stephen's Food Pantry and the canned goods will go the Ferguson Firehouse. They will request that CIA be responsible for Mother's and Father's Day Gifts. If CIA is not willing to take on this responsibility, BCE will continue and include the cost in their budget request. There will be no Rally Day event this year. The Advent Festival will be Sunday, December 7, 2025.

#### MISSION OUTREACH: Melinda Schuster

Melinda reported that Room at the Inn was provided a meal of Mostaccioli, green salad, fruit, brownies, and push-up ice pops and drinks. Room at the Inn is having a field day called "Back to School Bonanza" on Wednesday, August 13. Immanuel will provide three coolers filled with ice. The ice will be used for making snow cones and keeping cans of drinks cold.

Krescene Beck will present a Mission Moment for Festival of Sharing on Sunday, Aug. 17. We will provide the following four packs again this year: Paper Products, Personal Hygiene, Reading and Writing and Student Dental. We will also add a Mission Family Food Box. Lydia's House will be provided a meal on Wed, Aug. 20. Menu: Nacho bar with tortilla chips, taco meat, nacho cheese, Mexican rice, shredded lettuce, diced onions, diced tomatoes, salsa and sour cream. Krescene will assemble a team of volunteers to meet at the church on August 20 from 1:30 to 4:30 p.m. to put the meal together. The Mission Outreach Committee will hold a ZOOM meeting on August 27 to talk about Mission Outreach projects which can be done in 2026. We can then make our Budget request to Judy Sherman in a timely manner. Our next Regular Meeting will be scheduled for October.

#### **NOMINATING COMMITTEE:** Tim Guethler

Tim is forming a Nominating committee to begin seek candidates.

#### **TECHNOLOGY**: Walter Martinez

Thomas Hemingway will begin being compensated for 7 hours a week for the preparations needed for Sunday services. Additional time, if needed, will be approved by Pastor.

# **INVESTMENT AND INSURANCE:** Tim Guethler Bids need to be requested for 2026 insurance needs.

The following committees had no report at this time: Stewardship, Christians in Action (CIA), Worship, Budget and Finance, Safety and Security.

The Council entered Executive Session at 9:00 p.m. No further business appearing, the meeting adjourned at 9:22 p.m. with the Lord's Prayer.
