From our Pastor

Greetings Immanuel Family,

As we journey together into Advent, we center ourselves on the promise that Christ is continually coming to renew and restore us. This season reminds us that even in a world filled with uncertainty, Christ is still breaking into our lives, our church, and our community. Each week, we will light a candle on the Advent wreath, symbolizing the growing light of Christ in a world longing for hope. This year, we will focus on four gifts that lead us closer to the manger: **Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love.**

Hope is the assurance that God's promises never fail. It is the steady flame that keeps burning when everything else around us grows dim. During this first week of Advent, may we hold on to the hope that God is doing a new thing even when we cannot yet see it. Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. Isaiah 40:31

Peace is more than the absence of conflict; it is the calm that comes when we trust God's plan. Christ came to bring peace to a restless world and to quiet our anxious hearts. Let us seek that peace within ourselves, share it with others, and allow it to shape how we live each day. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. John 14:27

Joy is not dependent on our circumstances but on the presence of Christ. Even in trials, we can rejoice knowing that God is with us. As we light the pink candle this week, may our hearts overflow with the joy that comes from knowing Emmanuel, God with us. Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Philipians 4:4

Love is the heart of the Advent season. It was love that sent Jesus into the world, and it is love that continues to transform us. As we approach Christmas, let us share that same love in our homes, our church, and our community. *For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son. John 3:16*

President Don Morice called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m. John Bogdajewicz offered a devotion.

The minutes of the October were reviewed. It was moved and seconded (Judy Sherman/John Bogdajewicz) the minutes be accepted as printed. Motion Carried.

Financial Reports: Karl Klasing and Judy Sherman presented the financial reports. It was moved and seconded (Nancy Remmert/Melinda Schuster) that the Financial Reports be accepted as presented. Motion carried. Judy Sherman also presented the revised 2026 Budget which will be presented to the congregation at the December 14, 2025 congregational meeting. It was moved and seconded (Karl Klasing/Melinda Schuster) that the revised 2026 Budget be accepted as presented. Motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor reported the planned schedule through the end of December. Stewardship Sunday will be November 16.

Sunday, November 23 will be Youth Sunday. Decorating the Sanctuary for Christmas will be November 25 at 5:00 p.m. with dinner at the Brew House following. Room at the Inn will hold an open house at their remodeled location at 3 p.m. on December 4, 2025. The first Sunday of Advent, November 30, 2025 the Council will light the Advent Candle. The Advent Festival will be Sunday, December 7 after worship. On Sunday, December 14 the 2026 Budget will be presented to the congregation following worship. Bridging Ministries will hold their Christmas Choir Concert at Immanuel on Sunday, December 14, 2025 at 2:00 p.m. Christmas Eve Worship Services will be at 1:30 and 8 p.m.

Pastor reported that the family of Evelyn Horner has contributed a memorial in her memory which is designated to the Good Samaritan Fund which is used to assist Immanuel members who may need assistance. PARISH NURSE REPORT: Linda Stoecklin

Linda has provided 36 phone calls, sent 12 texts and 5 emails and assisted with one referral spending 29 hours on our behalf during the month of October.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Property and Grounds: John Bogdajewicz

ADF alarms have been installed in the Fellowship Hall as per required by UP. Since UP has limited funds, we agreed that the congregation should pay for the installation since it enhances our property. John reported that he had investigated the cost of having Fire Alarms installed in the Sanctuary Building. The estimate was \$61,300 which was not something we wished to take on at this time. The lawn work on the Sanctuary grounds may be delayed since it is getting late in the season to proceed with the work. The Organ needs some electrical repairs which will be scheduled. The dishwasher in the Education Building needs to be used more to keep it in good operating condition. We will request that the coffee mugs from Coffee Hour be washed at the Education Building at least once a month.

Board of Christian Education: Martha Snead

Advent materials have been received and will be mailed with the next newsletter. There will be a pot-luck for the holidays at December 2, 2025 meeting. Newly elected members of the Board are invited to attend. Installation of new members will be during worship on January 11, 2026. Sarah Ewald reported that 7 youth raised \$243.34 at the Bake Sale which will be used for Youth Activities. Attendance has been 3 to 7 youth. Those attending played Jeopardy and made Thanksgiving Cards for our shut-ins. On November 16, youth will practice the Christmas skit and make props for their performance at the Advent Festival on December 7. Youth Sunday is November 23. On December 7, the

The Mitten and Socks Tree has been put up and donations will be shared with ECH and our own Blessing Box. The Christmas Card Board has been put up in the Reception Room. Monies collected will be given to the new food pantry. ECH Food Baskets will be different this year. ECH has requested 10 totes for their Stepping Stones and 20 Totes for Foster Care. There will be two lists available along with the totes on Sunday, November 16, 2025. Completed totes should be returned to church by Sunday, December 7. Immanuel will provide a wonderful holiday meal for Lydia's House on Wednesday December 17.

Discussion of funds for set-up, etc. were considered and tentative plans are to open on days that other pantries in the area are not open. (Thursdays and Sundays). Room 103 would be a location available. More information will be available as more plans are finalized,

Following last months discussion regarding calling an Assistant Pastor, it was moved and seconded (Judy Sherman/Martha Snead) to call Kimberly McKenzie to this position.
